DAY 1

On first day trainer of the workshop Mr Sunil Kumar, described the students about the objectives of creative comics. Further, he added that Comics are a way of communicating ideas and learning through telling a story.

He focused on some elements of comic, probably the most important: image style, words, word containers, word-image relationships, undrawn inferences and layout.

He also discussed the main purpose of comics as a medium used to express ideas with images, often combined with text or other visual information. It typically takes the form of a sequence of panels of images. Textual devices such as speech balloons and captions can indicate dialogue, sound effects, or other information.

He also emphasised that comics do a great job of teaching the building blocks of reading in a visual way. Children can learn inference by studying the pictures. They start to identify and understand complex human emotions based on simple visuals. They learn the basics of dialogue because they can “see” it in a speech bubble.

The first day ended on an interesting note wherein the trainer gave the students a chance to create and imagine a comic story with some lesson/moral of their own for the next day.

DAY 2

Second day of the workshop started with formal welcome of the trainer Mr. Sunil Kumar and Co-trainer Miss Monika by the coordinator. This day, the trainer analysed the imaginative comic stories of each student and appreciated their work. Further, the trainer guided them how to complete their stories in all aspects and how to give them a suitable title. Each student was able to create/draw comics of their own imagination and choice.

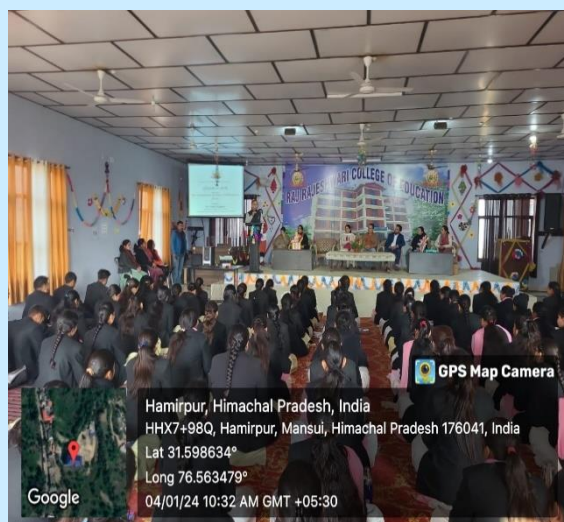

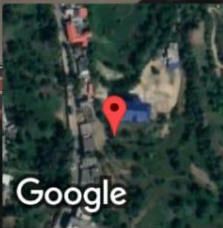

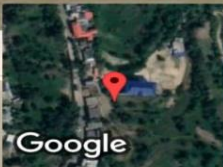
